Organizational Development: Collaborated in the transformation of the Rehabilitation Service from a custodial to an active treatment facility, reducing beds from 200 to 50 over the course of 10 years.

Leadership: Member of group that obtained funding and implemented the first Canadian Assertive Community Treatment Team for persons with serious mental illness. This model of service delivery has proliferated in Ontario so there are now more than 60 Assertive Community Treatment Teams in operation. Recruited psychologists to replace retiring psychometrists, to increase the professional competency of psychology staff. Achieved academic clinical appointments for psychologists at the University of Ottawa, Department of Psychology.

Clinical: Promoted community activities for inpatient psychiatric rehabilitation clients, including organizing a “Walking Group” for long-term patients, all of whom were discharged within a year of joining the group. Developed role for psychologist on Assertive Community Treatment Teams, including a team to provide service to persons with developmental disability and a psychiatric diagnosis.

Academic and Research Activities: Obtained academic appointments at University of Ottawa and Queen’s University. Supervised two Ph.D. students in clinical psychology, and several honours students. Taught undergraduate classes in Psychology of Learning, and Psychiatric Disabilities. Served as an external examiner for Ph.D. candidates at Queen’s University. Published a series of papers on quality of life of persons with serious mental illness, and the effectiveness of community based interventions.
